	<ul> <li>Symptomatic persons with:         <ul> <li>Fever or chills, Cough, Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, Fatigue, Muscle or body aches, Headache, New loss of taste or smell, Sore throat, Congestion or runny nose, Nausea or vomiting, and Diarrhea.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Symptomatic persons who are:</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Hospitalized</li> <li>Healthcare workers and other first responders</li> <li>Employees and residents in group living settings, and</li> <li>Over 65 years old or with <u>underlying health conditions</u> that place them at higher risk of serious complications</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Asymptomatic persons:</li> <li>If they are part of a public health investigation</li> <li>If they live or work in high risk settings, such as skilled nursing facilities or homeless shelters</li> <li>If they are a close contact of someone with a confirmed positive diagnosis of COVID-19, or</li> <li>If they are an essential worker.</li> </ul>
	Prioritization of routine testing among other asymptomatic people is not recommended at this time. People over the age of 65 or with underlying conditions do not necessarily need to be tested unless they have symptoms, have had an exposure or have been told by public health to be tested. Once again, please check with your healthcare provider about your specific situation and let their medical advice guide you.

	<ul> <li>As of 8/24/20, Access Services has completed over 235,468 meal and grocery deliveries to seniors and people with disabilities across four current projects.</li> <li>This week, #LetsFeedLACounty is hosting 2 drive-thru food distribution events in Lancaster (9/1) and Athens Park (9/3).</li> <li>Total distributed to date at 29 events is 1,801 tons of food which is the equivalent 2.9 million meals provided to 52,848 households.</li> <li>Drive-thru food distribution event held last week in Hollywood where 2,066 households, respectively, were provided 80 pounds of food, including shelf-stable items, dairy product frozen meat, and fresh produce.</li> <li>Will be expanding to 3 distributions per week starting September 15.</li> <li>#LetsFeedLACounty has secured 400 20-pound boxes of groceries from the LA Regional Food Bank for weekly delivery through the end of December to clients of the DHS Housing for Health program.</li> <li>Issuing additional CalFresh benefits up to the maximum allowed per family and allowing CalFresh recipients to purchase groceries online for delivery from Walmart and Amazon.</li> <li>Great Plates Delivered has a current service population: 5,495 seniors (32% increase sincefrom July).
